Please Note

- Punctuality is to be observed by all the children.
- Only the students of VI to X are permitted to come to school independently by bicycle.
- No student is allowed to come by Scooter / Motor Cycle.
- The school authorities will not be responsible for the students who are roaming outside school campus after the school hours, for any reason whatsoever. In case of delay in the conveyance, the students may remain within the school campus. Hence, you are requested to instruct your ward accordingly. (Please arrange the conveyance within 10 minutes of the final bell).
- You need to ensure that your daughter / son comes to school in clean, neat and proper school uniform and with a decent hair cut / hair style.
- It's strictly mandatory to send your ward with proper Tiffin to school daily.
- Only steel lunchbox and steel water bottle are allowed and they must be labelled.
- The school shall not allow any relative or neighbour to pick up the child during school hours. In case of any emergency, the child will be sent through a guardian with an authorisation letter duly signed by the parents with their mobile number. No one else will be entertained.
- Except during PTM, parents are not allowed to visit the classroom or meet teachers without prior permission of the Office-In charge.
- You are requested to submit an application beforehand whenever your ward is absent from school.
- Both the parents must attend all the Parent – Teacher Meetings to become aware of your ward's growth and development.
- Write the full address, mobile number and emergency contact numbers in your wards' school diary. If you change the mobile number(s), you may correct the number in the school diary and inform the class teacher.
- No parent/guardian is allowed to enter the school with a polythene/ plastic bag, which is strictly prohibited in the school campus.
- Active participation of the parents is sought in the events- yoga session, games and sports, aerobics, orientation programmes, seminars and so on, which are organised by the school management to follow CBSE norms and to develop a rapport between the school authorities and the parents.
